

CVPRD DEPARTMENT BOARD REPORTS JANUARY 2024

Human Resources

Staffing has been consistent for the HR department this month. All full-time staff have received a budget for new uniforms, and the apparel will arrive at the end of the month. An ongoing project that has been completed is revamping the Rec Buck program. This is a program that gives staff 'Rec Bucks' in the form of tickets to hand out to recognize each other's hard work. Staff will be able to trade tickets in for items such as CVPRD merchandise, office accessories, and other prizes.

Guest Services

Our new Guest Services Specialist Kai Galley started on Jan 3rd. She is working the evening shift and is already building relationships with our guests. We saw a lot of usage during winter break which went into January. Drop ins specifically were high with \$11,481 in revenue just for those 2 weeks. January 15% off the annual membership ended on Jan 31. Annual sales (along with renewals) totaled \$93,877 in revenue for January alone! Rentals have gotten back on track and totaled \$33,875 in revenue for the year 2023.

Maintenance

The sign from the old administration building was repurposed at the gymnastics center, and lettering was added. Some final touches of moving in were performed at the CVCC. Staff installed multiple clear acrylic posters to display pictures of the district's choosing.

Youth Sports


Registration is currently open for Youth Volleyball, Soccer, Softball, and baseball. Partnership with Mead added 13 teams to our league.

Gymnastics

The gymnastics program is midway through Session 5, and registration for Session 1 starts February 12. With the Senior Center moving into the new Community Center in January, gymnastics has been working hard to get the new Preschool Room ready for the new session. The Preschool Room will host gymnastics classes for ages 3-5 during the mornings and evenings. Having gymnastics classes in a smaller area for the younger kids will be very beneficial for the whole program. Gymnasts 3-5 will not be so overwhelmed coming into class with a smaller room, plus they will have the space to themselves without the older kids. (Big distraction). The other benefit will be for the older and team level classes. Currently all ages are in the gym, with preschool kids walking through classes which can cause injuries and delays in lessons.

Some of the changes to the old Senior Center space to the new Preschool Room, as well as the Gymnastics lobby include:

- Spackle and Paint
- New gymnastics carpet
- New Stereo system for kids music
- Demo of kitchen island and coffee area
- New Coaches closet staff belongings

Aquatics

This was the first full month as a StarGuards ELITE agency, the only main difference so far is lifeguards are now required to attend 4 hours of in-service training every month, rather than the 2-3 hours required in the past. Hank, Head Lifeguard, and Ryan, Aquatics Coordinator were able to co-teach the first StarGuard ELITE lifeguard class to the public. In this class, 3 new lifeguards were certified and have already started working at CVPRD. An updated private swimming lesson process was rolled out and is now an activity that guests can register for. So far, 22 unique guests have been served and most are new to private swimming lessons. There have been 79 time slots offered and 52 of them have filled.

January was a long awaited and exciting month as we kicked off our fitness programming at the new Carbon Valley Community Center. We are offering 16 fitness classes which includes Yoga, Zumba, Balance & Beyond, Tai Chi, and multiple SilverSneakers class formats. Many of these classes are already at capacity. We hope to add more classes in the future as scheduling and staff allow. At the recreation center we have added additional programming including our well attended Young Yogis program for ages 6-12. Other new classes for the month include Parent/Toddler Yoga, Zumba and Power Yoga.

Active Adults

2024 started out with a BANG! January 2nd the Carbon Valley Community Center opened its doors. The Community Center has been busy since it opened, holding 16 fitness classes a week as previously the Senior Center had 4. Patrons and staff are enjoying the spacious center, which has provided many groups space to meet and socialize before and after classes and activities where they did not share a space before. The Active Adults sent trips to the National Western Stock Show – Dancing Horses, Nordy's BBQ and toured the Ball Area with an unplanned viewing of the Colorado Avalanche Hockey team's practice. The opening of a new facility has brought much growth to the Active Adults Division, seeing quadruple the visitors each month for classes and activities and the Friendly Fork lunch numbers are going from an average of 100 each week to 120 each week. The Active Adults Division is looking forward in February to going to the Movie theatre to see "Argyll", The Denver Center for Performing Arts for "Message in a Bottle", Celestial Seasoning Tour and a lunch trip to the Cherry Cricket for Burgers.
