## **Human Resources**

May was all about training and development for HR! In May our Coordinator group continued learning and practicing Gapology. Gapology gives us the communication tools we need not only as a manager but as a leader within the District. We have also started to incorporate "16 Personalities" We had an amazing kickoff workshop where we were able to discus and learn about each other's personality types and begin to understand how each and every one of us interpret and react to different scenarios based on our personality. Our goal is to continue to work together in smaller groups as we learn and identify communication practices with each other based on our personality.

## **Guest Services**

Guest Services is fully staffed now with all full-time positions. Louis Barrett, Taylor Frost, Rachel Sallee, and Kai Galley are our Guest Services Specialists.

The Weld County Voucher program did not have as much funding this year as in years past. Due to this, they decided not to advertise the program as much, and as a result, we have not had anyone come to request a voucher with us this summer. We still have 2 weeks left in our Summer Fun Sale of 25% off the Quarterly. Currently, we are sitting at \$11,721 in revenue for this pass type.

Frederick High School bought 33 Quarterly Youth passes for certain kids who were part of a Leadership Club this year. Some of these kids may be struggling with high school and they wanted to promote a healthy and engaging summer for them. The kids have already started coming in to get those!

Outdoor work is in full swing. Mowing, ballfield preparation, weeding, irrigation checks, and tree trimming are some pieces that make up a lot of our time currently.

A new maintenance shed was installed at the Community Center. This allows for some additional, much-needed storage of equipment. It also provides convenient access for use at the building without the need for trailering. A new Walker mower was purchased out of our small equipment funds. This mower fell under our target budget and additional attachments were able to be purchased at this price including a plow blade to make it versatile for the winter.

Athletics and Maintenance formed a new relationship with Carbon Valley Academy, which gained us access to another baseball field! The field was very under-utilized and needed some care. Members of the maintenance team spent time deep edging base paths, pulling weeds, detail dragging the field, installing a new home plate, installing a new pitching mound, and installing new base anchors. Work in this field will continue.

# **Gymnastics**

The gymnastics program is seeing strong participation in the upcoming summer session, with a slight increase compared to the previous session (509-514 participants). Summer sessions often have variable participation due to factors such as summer sports, family vacations, and general seasonal activities. The introduction of a preschool room camera allows parents to watch their children during classes, enhancing the overall experience. The competitive teams have had a strong start to their season and are on track for continued success. The Optionals and Compulsories (girls' teams) competed in two meets, May 11th at Hyland Hills and May 31st at Broomfield; and the Boys Team had their first meet at Commerce City on May 10th. All teams will have another two meets in June. The girls' teams must get qualifying scores on each event to go to the State meet in July. The boys do not need qualifying scores to go to State in July.

## **Aquatics**

May in aquatics is always a transitionary month as we gear up for summer. There were no group lessons, but our private lessons continued to see growth and it was the first month that over 100 time slots were filled. The average number of lessons an individual does continues to hover around 4.5 lessons. We hired two new head lifeguards, one internal promotion, Austin Melson, and another an external/rehire, Jordan

Lohr (has spent 3 seasons at the Cove including when it was under CVPRD ownership). Avery and Ryan also conducted our second StarGuard ELITE Lifeguard Training class, we had nine participants and all of them were successful and hired. We are entering the summer fully staffed with about 45 employees and 18 swimming instructors! This is the highest our head count has been going into the summer season for the last 3 summers.
